GSR Institute of Craniofacial Surgery:

GSRICFS is extremely thankful to Smile Train for their supports with funds for operating children with cleft lip and palates. This year we operated 1200 patients out of which primary cleft lips were 391, primary palates were 367, secondary cases including alveolar bone grafting, fistula closures, and rhinoplasties were 371. We also operated 45 orthognathic surgeries (including Anterior maxillary distraction, Le fort 1 osteotomies, Rigid external distraction, Multidirectional distraction, Bilateral sagittal split osteotomies, Genioplasties), 8 vascular malformations, aesthetic rhinoplasties- 5, facial clefts- 6, neurofibroma- 2. We also performed five intracranial procedures with the support of Sterling Trust (Switzerland).









Speech Therapy:

Our speech department did around 1240 speech assessments and 650 demo therapies and speech therapies. We are again obliged by Smile train, Prof.Hermann F Sailer's and Dr.Erika Sailer's Cleft kinder Hilfe, Schweiz and Stichting Sumbing Bibir Foundation for supporting us with

speech therapies.



Orthodontics:

Our philosophy of holistic treatment led us to complete more than 25 orthodontic cases of our cleft patients by the support of Smile Train and Prof.Hermann F Sailer's and Dr.Erika Sailer's Cleft kinder Hilfe, Schweiz.





School Project:
